Scouting in Norway:

Scouting and Guiding is served by the Speidernes Fellesorganisasjon, a federation of Norges Speiderforbund (Norwegian Guide and Scout Association) and Norges KFUM-KFUK-speidere (YWCA-YMCA Guides and Scouts of Norway).



The Norwegian Guide and Scout Association: Norges Speiderforbund, (NSF) is a Norwegian Scouting and Guiding association founded in its present form in 1978, when the Norwegian Boy Scout Organization (founded in 1910) and the Norwegian Girl Guide Organization (founded in 1921) merged. As of 2008, NSF had 20,000 members, organized in 29 districts and 6 corps with 450 local groups. The association is divided into four agegroups: Beavers - ages 6 to 8, Cubs/Brownies - ages 8 to 10, Scouts/Guides - ages 10 to 16, Rovers - ages 16 to 24.

The Norwegian Guide and Scout Association is an ideal organization based on teaching children, youth and adults the fundamentals of responsibility taking, accepting challenges, new experiences and personal development. "Learning by doing" and leader training are important elements of the movement. Other important elements are outdoor activities, friendship, practical knowledge and improved quality of life.

The YWCA-YMCA Guides and Scouts of Norway: Norges KFUK-KFUMspeidere) is a Norwegian Scouting and Guiding association founded in its present form in 2003, when the YMCA-Scouts and the YWCA-Guides divided in 20 districts with about 350 local troops. Guiding within the YWCA was started in 1920, Scouting in the YMCA in 1945. In 2003 both both former programs and the units were free to decide if they followed the Guide or the Scout scheme. In 2007, a new organizational structure as well as new program was decided. Since 2007, the association is divided in four sections according to age: Uppdagere (Discoverers) - ages 8 to 10. Stifinnere (Pathfinders) - ages 10 to 12, Vandrere (Wanderers) - ages 12 to 17, Rovere (Rovers) - ages 17 and older.
